From Pastor Steve...

Even though it's a crazy and hectic time for most of us, Christmas is always a great time of year! We love the music and

decorations; the food and the connections with family and friends; and we love story of the birth of Jesus. But sometimes, even when we focus on the birth of the Jesus as the center of our Christmas celebration, we get caught up in silent nights and angels and shepherds.

But here's the real point of Christmas: in Jesus, God himself entered our everyday world to meet us and save us in a way that nobody else could. The point of Christmas is really not about how or where Jesus was born, as much as it is the belief that God himself was doing something completely new and unique in and through Jesus. Before Jesus, God had spoken through somebody else sometimes it was a prophet; sometimes it was an angel; sometimes it was through an unexpected person with a dream or a vision.

But in Jesus, God himself became the "somebody else." God himself took the responsibility to speak and act and give himself away for the life of the whole world. That's the real marvel and mystery of Christmas. It's what the fancy theological word "incarnation" really means - instead of sending "somebody else," God took on flesh to become the "somebody else" in our lives.

As we consider our mission and ministry as a Christian community in 2016, our Council and Stewardship Team are asking us all to consider that, just as God became the "somebody else" in our lives, we too are called by God to be the "somebody else" through whom God works to share God's love and presence in our congregation, our community and our world.

Too often, we rely on "somebody else" taking care of something we all know requires everybody's commitment. But part of our calling as Christians is that each one of us is also called to imitate Jesus by being the "somebody else."

You and I are the "somebody else" who's called to act and make God's help a real and living experience in our world. You and I are the "somebody else" who's called to give and share so that important work gets done. And you and I are often the "somebody else" who makes God's love known to another person, even if we don't realize it at the time.

In Jesus, God has become the "somebody else" in our lives. And through Jesus, God calls each and every one of us to be the "somebody else" in the life of our congregation, our community and our world.

Women's Book Group

Women's Book Group will celebrate Christmas together on Thursday, December 10th, sharing thoughts about The Invention of Wings: A Novel by Sue Monk Kidd. Aly Willard described the novel on Amazon.com, "Wings is based loosely on the real-life story of Sarah Grimke, a Southern aristocrat whose father is a bigshot judge on South Carolina's Supreme Court, where Sarah wants to be eventually. She is given a slave (Handful) for her 11th birthday, which strikes the little firebrand as something ridiculous. How can someone OWN another person? She doesn't want the "gift" but she's forced to accept.

From there, the story is set in motion and follows the two women as they struggle for a common goal: freedom. Handful, naturally, struggles for her freedom from bondage, and Sarah for her freedom from the misogynist oppression of presuffrage era sexism. She's taught how to needlepoint and play piano, but she escapes her constrained existence by getting into her father's forbidden library and dreaming of great things like abolition work.

Kidd does a wonderful job portraying the barbarism of that time in American history and especially the horrid mistreatment of the slaves, graphically detailing whippings and other abuses. She also intertwines the characters beautifully in almost a female version of Huckleberry Finn." The evening is hosted by Pamela Cook. Festivities begin at 7:30 pm and include a Christmas tradition, a Yankee swap. Each attendee is asked to bring a wrapped book (new or gently used)


