From Pastor Steve...

Every year, I feel like September is "get back to normal" month. Vacations are over. School begins again, and all the "regular" fall programming at church starts back up.

Not this year! This September is anything but a return to "normal". Almost everything is different from the way it was before the pandemic. School is still in virtual learning mode. And worship is still online. And while we have glimmers of things that start to give us a feel of the way things were, it's not clear when things will really feel like they're back to normal.

Of course, these past few months have also been a time when we've learned to do some new things and adapt in ways that many of us hadn't considered before. At Prince of Peace, we've learned how to do online worship, and we've made some AV upgrades in the past few weeks to enhance the worship experience and to ensure that we'll be able to livestream to people who need and want the online worship experience even after we begin to return to "normal." This month, we'll also be experimenting with virtual choir and Grace Notes, so there are some exciting things happening even when things aren't "normal"!

But in all this, I've discovered that there is one thing that's still normal around here. Jesus continues to be with us, to guide us and to strengthen us, even when we're not together. In fact, I've sometimes come to appreciate Jesus' presence and strength in ways that maybe I wasn't so tuned into before. Hopefully, that's been the case - and will continue to be the case - for you as well.

As we began this "new normal" it wasn't clear (and it still isn't) where this experience will lead us. And it would have been easy to imagine that churches would have just dissolved and closed like so many other businesses in our community. But it's clear that we're more than a business or even a volunteer organization. We're a community called together by the Holy Spirit, even when we need to stay 6 feet apart. We're a community continually strengthened by Jesus' Word, even when we hear that word online. We're a community that really is a "communion of saints" because of the abiding presence of God in our lives.

That presence of God is a normal part of our lives. It always has been, and it always will be. And even if everything else seems upside down right now, Jesus' presence with us will always part of whatever our "normal" is!



Preschool - Elementary School

Dig In with us! Since we'll be meeting via Zoom this fall, we've chosen Group's Dig In "Foundations of Faith Today" curriculum. The curriculum has modifications to support virtual learning and includes two hours of content for every Bible story for each age group, so we can choose the interactive elements that work best for our learners.

Dig In features a "you are there" approach, with a new Bible story each week. We have options to dig deeper into the story, and to explore the Bible point through games, experiments, crafts, and brief videos. The learners will also sing and dance along with by Ms. Danielle.

Our goal is to have the most age-specific experience possible while also giving the learners the chance to interact with their peers. Gaithersburg HELP

Fortunately, things have quieted down for now, and the number of hungry clients is back to usual levels. There are still supply chain issues buying some things.



Most needed right now are Mac & Cheese, cereal, pasta and rice (1 lb is best - we can't break down 10lb bags to share between families)

There are a number of volunteer needs. For more information look on GaithersburgHELP.org or talk to Hope Walker. If you fill out an application on the website, someone will contact you.

- 1. A Treasurer, somebody with a CPA type of background
- 2. UMAN also needs a treasurer, and this job can be done by someone with bookkeeper skills
- 3. A leadership role in the Prescription/Financial aid area, medical background not required, but good organizational skills.
- 4. Drivers, over age 18 available during weekdays hours. The clients are coming back, but not all of the usual volunteer drivers have returned. How often you drive and where is your choice.
- 5. Ride scheduler, works virtually
- 6. Food and Infant Needs Coordinators, work from home one day a month from 9am-2pm Thanks for your ongoing support.



How to Donate to Gaithersburg HELP

Because many people have asked how they can help <u>Gaithersburg HELP</u>, we are offering the following three options - drop food off to either of two locations, ship food, or donate money. Details are provided below. Please note that if you already have an organization or friend collecting food for HELP, you may continue using that approach. Thank you for your concern.

Drop-off: If you want to drop off food at the **Pantry,** please adhere to the specified time frame. Deliveries can be safely dropped outside only during the time period shown. If you want to drop off donations at the church, please leave them outside:

- Gaithersburg HELP **Pantry**, 301 Muddy Branch Rd, only between 1:00 and 3:00 PM, Mon- Fri when volunteers are in the pantry and can move deliveries inside. Do not leave things at other hours as they will likely disappear.
- Prince of Peace Lutheran Church, 11900 Darnestown Rd. (Leave food under the covered area by either the front or back doors.)

Online: If you would like to order online and have food shipped, here are four home addresses of volunteers who have covered porches to receive deliveries. **Specify Gaithersburg HELP as the addressee** on the order form:
