Lent is a time to focus on strengthening our relationships with God, with one another and with the world Jesus came to save. Even though we have to do this differently this year because of Covid, I hope that everybody by now has had a chance to look at and maybe even do a few things as part of our Lenten Challenge - 2021!

During the six weeks of Lent, everyone is encouraged and challenged to do at least 3 things in each of these three areas:

Strengthen your relationship with God

 Attend at least 3 additional events outside of Sunday online worship (e.g. Online Wednesday evening prayer, Outdoor Communion, Women's Bible Study, Theology on Tap, etc.)

Strengthen your relationship with others in our congregation

 Reach out to at least 3 people you know personally from church who you haven't been in contact with lately (by phone, email or by sending a card)

Strengthen your relationship with God's wider world

(pick three - for example one of each; two food donations and one invite; etc.)

- Make a direct online donation to one of our social ministry partners (e.g. <u>Gaithersburg</u> <u>HELP</u>, <u>Interfaith Works</u>, <u>Lutheran World Relief</u>)
- Drop off food for Gaithersburg HELP at the church
- Invite someone you know who doesn't go to church to participate with you in online worship

If we all do these things, we'll end Lent having grown closer to God. We'll have reconnected with one another. And we'll have made a difference in the life of the world Jesus came to save!
