In-person Worship Changes at Prince of Peace

As of Friday, May 28, 2021, Montgomery County lifted all Covid restrictions. Therefore, many of the things we were doing in order to comply with the orders will no longer be necessary. Council adopted a policy for worship (beginning Sunday, May 30).

We will continue to hold one service on Sundays at 10 am. This service will also be livestreamed.

We will no longer ask people to sign up to come to worship, as social distancing requirements have been phased out.

We will phase back into "normal" worship processes.

Masks will no longer be required. However, as CDC recommends, we will still encourage non-vaccinated people to wear masks.

Nursery will not be offered for the time being, since small children are not currently vaccinated.

As I always do around this time of year, I've been spending a lot of time getting my yard ready for the summer. I've done lots of weeding. I've spread 3 yards of mulch. And I'm now in the process of planting several flats of flowers. It's always a big task and takes several weeks. But around Memorial Day weekend, all of the preparation is done. I'm pleased with how it looks. And inevitably, I sit back and think to myself, "I'm done!"

But of course, I'm not done! I've just finished the preparation. Over the course of the summer, I will need to water and feed the plants. More weeds will have to be pulled. Grass will need to be cut. And lots of other things will need doing as I use my backyard for BBQs and get togethers.

SPOTLIGHT

Council adopted the following policy for worship (beginning Sunday, May 30):

We will continue to hold **one service on Sundays at 10 am. This service will also be livestreamed.** If attendance grows to need it, we may add a second service on Saturday evening which will not be livestreamed.

We will no longer ask people to sign up to come to worship, as social distancing requirements have been phased out.

We will phase back into "normal" worship processes, including specifically:

Masks will no longer be required. However, as CDC recommends, we will still encourage non-vaccinated people to wear masks and make clear that anyone who is more comfortable wearing a mask is free to do so.

Nursery will not be offered for the time being, since small children are not currently vaccinated.

Seating will be expanded, but we will continue to offer some socially distanced seating for those who desire it.

Hand sanitizer stations will continue to be provided.

Whenever the AC is not on (which automatically brings in fresh air) windows will be cracked opened to ensure fresh air circulation.

We will resume distributing communion to inperson worshippers. However, communion "snack packs" will still be available for those who are uncomfortable coming up to receive communion. We will also continue to advertise "Holy Communion in Extraordinary Times" as an option for online worshippers.

Worshippers will continue to be encouraged to download the bulletin file on their own device, as well as to donate online.

Everything worshippers need will continue to be in the bulletin or on the projector, so there will be no need to handle worship books.

Congregational singing will be allowed to resume.

We will work towards food and beverages for fellowship time in ways that accord with guidance from CDC.

As before, you are welcome to attend live or online, whichever is more comfortable for you!



RECENT EVENTS

Confirmation Service Project 2021

On May 1st, the annual service project for 2021-2022 Confirmation classes honored a past patron of Prince of Peace. Under the leadership of Paul and Mary Hlavinka of the Muddy Branch Alliance, the confirmands and parents (19 total) picked up trash along Speicher's Run. We collected many bags of trash, including 3 tires (one was larger than the other 2 and was especially entrenched in the mud), barbed wire, a fire hose part, another black hose, a rusted metal frame (several hefty poles after it was broken down), a small table, a brake disc, a street sign (No Motorized Vehicles which can be put up at the start of the trail), numerous plastic bottles, chip wrappers, plastic bags, cans and the like! But not all that was found was trash - We found a baseball in great condition (probably lost from a backyard practice) and a blue jay feather. Paul also pointed out garlic mustard and bamboo (invasive species), Japanese barberry (a common backyard bush that might harbor deer ticks (!), and even a jack-in-the-pulpit!
