
Help Afghan Allies

From Pastor Steve...

Over the past few weeks, I've been watching a series of video seminars put together by several ELCA Synods in the western US. They're intended to help all of us think through some of the ways that we can grow ministry in hybrid ways - that is, neither going back to the way things were before the pandemic (which often weren't working), nor simply doing stuff online. It's a both/and approach to our ministries.

It's clear, as we've lived through these past 18 months or so that nobody wants to simply stay online. We need actual face-to-face in-person interaction with each other. At the same time. we've also learned that some of the ways we were forced to adapt to have been extraordinarily helpful. Even though we're now back to in-person worship, the fact that we continue to livestream the service allows folks who live far away, who are homebound, or who can't be in church at a particular day or time, to participate in worship. Zoom meetings, which can't replace all meetings, can replace some of them, removing the stress and time it takes for everyone to commute to a single place for the meeting. And it's clear that having material and information online can often help and supplement our in-person events.

Hybrid ministry is about taking the best of inperson and the best of online and finding ways to integrate them so that more people can participate more deeply in the community of Jesus Christ. So, we'll be exploring how to do that over the next few months.

For example, we'll continue to livestream the service, so that the worship experience continues to be available to more people. We'll look for ways to use our online connections to foster in-person connections. We'll be trying some different ways of doing faith formation. For example, Confirmation this fall will have both online and inperson components. We'll also be joining with two other congregations to do a book study by Zoom. And we'll continue to focus our in-person gatherings on events which help us build community with one another.

We'll be trying some different ways of doing things. Some will work, and others won't. But these past months have shown us that God has made us more resilient than we perhaps thought we were. God has shown us some new ways of connecting with each other which we need to take advantage of. And most importantly, God has shown us new ways and new possibilities to make the Gospel of Jesus a living reality in our lives and in the lives of our neighbors.





Preschool through Elementary School

Each week, we will meet for Opening in the sanctuary, where we will introduce a Bible truth, share our offerings, and participate in music led by Danielle Drobny.

Next, we will head to our Preschool - Kindergarten, 1st - 2nd Grade, and 3rd - 5th Grade classrooms, where we will use Group's DIG IN curriculum. DIG IN features a "you are there" approach with a new Bible story each week. We are excited about resuming in-person activities such as active games, crafts, and science experiments. Our workshop leaders will be Lisa Conary, Janet Levine, Jamie Pflasterer, and Anne Witten. Jacqui Bardill and Trish Taylor will be our elementary shepherds.

We want your students to feel comfortable, so remember that parents are always welcome in class.

Middle School

We will use Sparkhouse Re:form Ancestors to explore the biblical ancestors of our faith. Using quirky worksheets and short films, we'll discover similarities between ourselves and the many unlikely people chosen by God to do the extraordinary. Our Middle School leaders are Samuel Bornhorst and Sarah Kuykendall.

High School

We use movies such as *Courageous*, *The Grace Card*, and *Miracles from Heaven* to open discussions on how to handle difficulties people face. We will watch part of a movie, identify the difficulties the characters are facing and, using the Bible, concordances, and topical Bibles, explore what help we can find there.
