From Pastor

Steve...

As most of you know, right after Easter, my dog Blake was diagnosed with a condition known as degenerative myelopathy. It's basically doggie Lou Gehrig's disease. So, over the last several months, I've had to learn a lot about how to care for Blake as his condition worsens and, most importantly, how to keep him happy and comfortable through this time.

As Blake's condition worsens, he's less and less able to walk. And so even back a few months ago when he could still walk about a mile on his own, I knew I'd need to get a hind-end lift and a doggie wheelchair. When I first started researching the wheelchair, I remember feeling a sense of dread that that time was coming.

But about a month ago, Blake got to the point where he really couldn't walk any substantial distance without the use of the chair. And while, like his dad, he's resistant to help and initially really fought me to get him into the harness and the chair, he's now well acclimated to it! In fact, we can now take walks in the chair for almost a mile at a time.

And the other day, as we were taking one of our walks with the chair, it occurred to me that I was so thankful that we were able to do this! We can actually take walks again (at least for now). And Blake is visibly happy to be able to again sniff the neighborhood and be able to read and reply to "pee-mail"!

And that experience reminded me that usually, we look for things to be thankful for in the midst of happiness and abundance. But often, it's in the difficult times that we can be most thankful for the things (like the chair) that help us to cope. It's often in the midst of problems that we're most thankful for our blessings. And sometimes, especially when things are going to get tougher before they get better, we can most be thankful for the strength and help God gives us to live in the moment. So as we celebrate Thanksgiving this year, I'm paradoxically going to be more thankful for the situations and opportunities God has given me than I might have if things were easier.



YOUTH MINISTRY

Sunday School High School Class

High School Class

The high school class is developing a set of questions to use with guest speakers to learn more about their jobs. We will have more to update on this aspect of our class later. In addition, the high school class is continuing to watch and discuss movies. We are currently watching "Facing the Giants." This film does a really good job of presenting dealing with fear, facing obstacles, and the power of prayer.

Middle School Class

Middle School Sunday School has been active inperson and online! Students have been learning about individuals in the Bible, their stories, and how we can relate to them today in God's big picture. We ask the students to try to imagine what it was like for these people, putting stories in the context of Biblical times to better understand the impacts of the time on different groups of people.

Elementary Classes

One of the lessons we studied in Sunday School was Jesus making friends with Matthew. We discussed

our friendships and how to be friends with new people. Here, in the Lower Elementary class, we played a game using magnets to see who could collect the most pipe cleaner disciples. We also made a friendship basket to illustrate our Bible story.



The Lower and Upper Elementary classes also talked about the amazing miracle in John 4 of Jesus curing the official's son. We talked about amazing things we have seen people do, and that Jesus's miracles recorded in the Bible are even more amazing. Although we don't know why some people are cured and not others, we can ask God these questions in heaven one day. We do know that the miracles in the Bible helped people in Bible times and today see God's power and love. Then we considered the capabilities of the human body as further evidence of God's amazing power. Before and after jumping jacks, we compared our heart rates. The brain is also amazing - each of us thinks about 50,000 thoughts a day!

Bible Presentation


On October 17, several of our second graders were presented Bibles by their parents. The Bibles are inscribed with the child's name and signed by Pastor Steve and Sunday School leaders. We read from the Bible every week in Sunday School, and now each child has their own Bible to also enjoy at home. It is heartwarming to see their excitement during the worship service as they receive their Bibles, and each week, as they gain skills, knowledge, and inspiration reading from the Bible during class.

Social Justice Ministry News

The Social Justice Ministry Committee is reforming at Prince of Peace, after a hiatus during the pandemic. Through this new effort, we hope to serve our Community, encourage service among our congregation members, including our youth, grow our congregation's commitment to service, and reach out to our own members who may have needs. We are a group of about six people right now, and we welcome anyone who may want to join us in this endeavor. We are meeting on Zoom now, but we will reassess this as the situation changes. If you would like to have the Zoom link to join this meeting, and find out what is happening, contact Jennifer Maloney, and she will send you the link.

Our first priority is to support the Afghan Refugee Resettlement efforts at Lutheran Social Services in the DC area. They are the main resettlement organization for this area. There are a number of ways our congregation can help in this effort. There is a link in our online bulletins and in the Thursday email of happenings to the Lutheran Social Services Website. Here are some opportunities to be aware of:

1.You can go to the Lutheran Social Services site and donate money to them for Refugee Resettlement at any time.

2. LSS is looking for sponsors to help a family with apartment setup, and other needs that the family may experience in their new home. Right now, it appears that LSS has enough sponsors for apartment setup. We may look at this as a possible future commitment.

3. There are opportunities for mentoring and tutoring and providing transportation to individuals, and these include high school students who can mentor their peers.

4. You can buy necessities for Afghan Families through Amazon and have items sent directly to LSS. There are links to the needs on the LSS website. They include, bedding, household items such as brooms, waste baskets and small electronics.

5. Advocacy for Resettlement efforts with Federal and Local elected officials.

6. Participate in an upcoming Prince of Peace fundraiser to purchase some of the more expensive items that are needed, such as laptops. More coming on that!

Please consider becoming involved in this effort in some way. This is an important service that will impact the lives of many people. Detailed information on all these opportunities is on the Lutheran Social Services website.

We also plan to continue with past projects, such as Gaithersburg Help, the Christmas Giving Tree and Gifts of Hope, as well as some new ideas for Christmas. (see "Coming in December" below.) Prince of Peace has always been a caring congregation, and we hope to make sure that you are aware of opportunities to care for our community all during the year.

Coming in December

Through the ELCA GOOD GIFTS program, you can feed a refugee family for a week (\$50), send a woman to farmer's field school (\$75), or buy a community fish farm (\$250). During December, Social Ministry will distribute coin boxes to collect change to support this program. Follow this link for more information,
