From Pastor Steve...

We don't really have any idea about which day or month Jesus was born. There's no mention of Jesus' birthdate anywhere in the New Testament. And the only clue we might have to the time of year comes from Luke, who tells us shepherds were out in the fields keeping watch over their flocks by night. And if that was the case on the day Jesus was born, it certainly was NOT in the wintertime, when shepherds and their sheep would have been huddled together keeping warm in the caves which served as sheep pens!

But we celebrate Jesus' birth on what was, on the ancient Roman calendar, the darkest day of the year - the day of the winter solstice. In the first century, the Romans celebrated December 25 as the "Feast of the Unconquered Sun" - the day when the sun slowly began to return and the days grew brighter. After the legalization of Christianity in the 4th century, Christians began to celebrate Jesus' birth on that day, partly as a way of suppressing the pagan holiday, and partly as a way of bearing witness to the true light of God coming into the darkness of the world. (This is why we still read the first chapter of John's Gospel on Christmas Day.)

At least in the northern hemisphere, there's also something meaningful about celebrating the light of God in the midst of the darkest days. It's often the case that light is most noticed when there's not so much of it around. It's often the case that light is most appreciated when it's hard to see where you're going. And it's often the case that light is most needed when the darkness is deepest.

Celebrating Jesus' coming into the world at this time of year can serve to remind us that God is present and coming into our lives even and especially when we face our darkest moments. Celebrating Jesus' coming into the world at this time of year can help us to appreciate the moments of light that help guide us and strengthen us when our way is dark. And celebrating Jesus' coming into the world at this time of year lifts up the good news that no darkness that surrounds us

will ever overcome the light of Jesus which has come into the world (John 1:5).

Social Justice Ministry News Afghan Refugee Event

The Social Justice Ministry Committee continues to look for ways that Prince of Peace can support Afghan Refugees as they resettle in the Washington Region. Lutheran Social Services is the lead organization in settling people in this area and is involved on many levels in this effort. They are helping people to find housing and are in great need of household items to furnish new homes. If you want to find more personal ways to connect, there are a number of ways you can volunteer such as serving as a mentor, tutor, or driver.
