### **PoP Council Meeting Minutes**

### March 8, 2022

Jon did Devotions.

7:35

Terry reported a good financial picture for the church, which he expects to continue. The Social Justice Ministry has been very active and requesting benevolence payments. One such payment was made in February to Gaithersburg Help. The Feast Fund balance is \$65K.

7:39

Pastor Steve discussed his report as distributed prior to the meeting. The live Ash Wednesday service was attended by 25 people. Holden evening prayer will be held at 7:15 PM both live and online, preceded by wine & cheese, fellowship, and the labyrinth in the Fellowship Hall. There will be a single Easter service at 10 AM. Volunteers are needed to coordinate the Easter Egg hunt around the service. VBS is also in need of a volunteer to coordinate/run the event if it is to happen this year.

A schematic of the patio project was distributed prior to the meeting. The proposed project includes pavers for the large area between the back door, the fellowship hall doors, and the narthex door; a seating wall with lights and outlets; a gas line for a grill; drainage; landscaping; and concrete repairs. The total cost is \$75K which will be paid from the Feast Fund (and potentially the Building Fund for the concrete repairs portion). The project will start in mid-April, after Easter, and is expected to take about 4 weeks. Council voted to approve the project.

Dekker provided an update on the shed project. He will place the order for the shed ASAP and will notify Bill, Chet, and Pastor Steve about the expected delivery date so clean-out of the old shed can be organized. Bill will procure a dumpster for items to be thrown away as well as for the demolished shed.

Laura reported that she is working with a new Solar Energy World representative for the solar panels project. An update will be provided at the April meeting.

Bill and Chris provided an update on planning for the Yard Sale, which will take place on June 4 from 7 AM-2 PM. They will move forward with contacting appropriate church members to assist with reserving the tent and moving truck, applying for the special food license, and updating the sign and advertising materials (flyers, website, email announcement). Department chairs/co-chairs will be identified by asking Rebecca Claycamp for past lists and by requesting volunteers once all departments have been identified. Bill and Chris will propose a list of items that cannot be donated, including knick-knacks/collectibles, computers, and large heavy items like CRT TVs and entertainment centers. Bill will contact Helen about feasibility of tracking how much money is made by department to inform planning for future yard sales. A Montgomery County police officer will not be used for this year's event.

### Senior Pastor Report – April 19, 2022

For the first Easter in 3 years, we finally had in-person worship again! Easter Sunday in-person attendance was 110, which was on the higher side of what we expected. Maundy Thursday and Good Friday services were also around 40% of pre-Covid levels, which again is within expectations. Online attendance was also good for all of our Holy Week and Easter services.

Our Lenten services also went well. People especially enjoyed the opportunity for fellowship before the service, and a few took advantage of the Labyrinth as well.

We have been advertising some of our most pressing volunteer needs, without much response, but we will talk more about some of that at the Council meeting. However, we do have a couple more people willing to help with the AV board; Chris and Bill have been able to personally recruit some department chairs for Yard Sale; and Social Justice Committee has been doing a good job of recruiting help for the upcoming auction. So, there is some good news as far as recruiting volunteers goes!

Along with that good news, our patio / courtyard project is now underway! Weather has already caused some delay, but we're still hoping it will be complete before Yard Sale. As the patio nears completion, we will be running a gas line to the outside corner of the building near the kitchen so that a new natural gas grill (currently being ordered) can be installed on the new patio. Concurrently, the shed replacement project is proceeding, with the new shed kit already purchased and under a tarp next to the shed. We are planning to do some emptying / sorting this coming weekend. Once the patio project is complete, and we are beyond Yard Sale, we will proceed to fixing the baseboard heating registers throughout the building.

# **Monthly Financial Summary - March 2022**

### **Statement of Activities**

### **Contributions**

March was consistent with our current giving pattern. Total revenues were \$25,191 up a bit from February as we received a nice Thrivent donation of \$850 and an Amazon Smiles donation of \$62. Still, this was under our plan of \$28,236 by \$3,045.

### **Expenses**

Expenses for the month were \$27,507, against an adjusted plan of \$27,486, over plan by \$21, and over our revenue by \$2,316. There were no exceptional expenses in February and we made two additional benevolence payments of \$2,000 to Lutheran World Relief and \$2,050 to Lutheran Social Services. Benevolence payments to date total \$4,222 against a plan of \$33,000.

### **Surplus**

Our income to expense ratio for 2022 declined in March from \$8,918 at the end of February to \$6,602 the end of March.

### **Fund Balance Report**

The General Operating Fund stands at \$117,226, a \$2,316 decrease from the end of February. The Building Fund had total receipts of \$208, a disbursement of \$2,030 and an ending balance of \$165,787. The Debt Reduction Fund had total receipts of \$200, and an ending balance of \$2,400. The balance was transferred to the Feast Fund on March 30, 2022 per established protocols. The Feast Fund had contributions of \$2,191, a disbursement of \$11,250 for the deposit on the patio project and an ending balance of \$56,724. Total revenues/contributions to all funds from all sources were \$25,954. All other Fund Balances are positive and in good standing.

## **Cash Activity Report**

The adjusted beginning cash balance on March 1, 2022 was \$434,180, and the ending balance was \$419,5545 as of March 31, 2022, a decrease of \$14,626 from February. The drawdown can be attributed primarily to the patio project and disbursements from our Designated Fund for various causes that have been in that account for a number of years.
