"We beg you, brothers and sisters, not to be quicky shaken in mind or alarmed ... by letter, as though from us." (2 Thessalonians 2:2). Paul wrote these words to the early Christians in the city of Thessalonika, because they apparently were receiving letters claiming to be from Paul that told them alarming and untrue things!

Today, of course, this is done by email! Most of us are regularly warned by our banks and credit card companies not to respond to suspicious looking emails or to open the attachments. Occasionally, companies get "hacked" - that is, people actually get into the online databases of companies and steal information. More often, though, the emails we get are the result of "spoofing" - that is, it's a fake email address that appears to be from a legitimate source, hoping to get people to respond (usually to get personal information or money.)

These "spoofs" aren't limited to banks and credit cards. Over the last several years, a number of people at Prince of Peace have received spoof emails claiming to be from me or Prince of Peace. Please be on the lookout for these spoofs as well! Sadly, anyone at anytime can create a fake gmail addresss, for example, and set it up so that when it comes to your inbox, it says it's from "Santa Claus", "Mickey Mouse" or "Pastor Steve."

If an email seems weird, please check the actual address it's being sent from. If it does not come from a poplutheran.org domain, it is NOT from us. Also, remember that neither I nor anyone at PoP will ever ask you to send us a "gift card" (or to make any donation other than through our regular, secure online giving link). It is not necessary to forward these messages on to us, but please, DO NOT respond to them or open any links.

There are lots of ways in which we still have many of the same problems and issues of early Christians in the first century. Sadly, this is one of them! So, as Paul cautioned, don't be alarmed, but also please be on the lookout for spoofs!



Setting is Warwickshire in the 1580s. Agnes is a woman as feared as she is sought after for her unusual gifts. She settles with her husband on Henley Street, Stratford, and has three children: a daughter, Susanna, and then twins, Hamnet and Judith. The boy, Hamnet, dies in 1596, aged eleven. Four years or so later, the husband writes a play called Hamlet. The author breathes new life into the story of a loss usually consigned to literary footnotes, and provides an unforgettable vindication of Agnes, a woman intriguingly absent from history.
