# From Pastor Steve...

February has always felt like an "in-between" time to me. In January, we celebrate the beginning of a new year. In March, Spring begins and we're looking towards Easter. But it always feels to me like February is month where we're just "in-between."

Even in the liturgical cycle, it often feels this way. Most of February is what we call the "season after Epiphany." The Christmas cycle is over, and we're getting ready for Lent. And in-between, we're reading stories about Jesus calling his first followers and beginning to do a little teaching. It doesn't seem like these are the really exciting parts of the story - you know, the parts where angels sing, or Jesus performs miracles or rises from the dead.

And yet, these "in-between" stories are actually important stories. They lay the groundwork for everything Jesus is about to do. They help us understand who Jesus really is. And perhaps most importantly, they remind us that God is at work and moving powerfully in our world even in "in-between" times.

Often, I look for God to act in big and powerful ways. I enjoy the stories of Christmas and Easter and Pentecost. And sometimes, I'm so busy looking forward to the "big events" in my life that I can miss out - or at least not fully recognize - the slow, deliberate, preparatory things that God is doing in my life. And sometimes, I need the "in-between" seasons of the Church year to remind me that Jesus is working in my life all the time, not just in the big, splashy moments.

So, whatever times or seasons of your life feel like "in-between" times, remember that God is at work in those moments as well. Pay attention to the ways that God may be preparing you for the next thing through those moments. And be open to the ways that Jesus is leading you - perhaps in small and subtle ways - even in times that feel like they're just "in-between" the big events.
