The old saying goes, "March comes in like a lion and goes out like a lamb." Around here, that often hasn't been the case, as March often arrives feeling like a warm, spring day and ends with an ice storm! Still, March is a transitional month that leads us from winter into the spring. Warmer days are coming. Buds are coming out on the trees. And soon there will be new outdoor opportunities to enjoy.

This year, most of Lent is in March as well. And Lent is also a transitional time. In the ancient church, Lent was a time of preparation for baptism, and the renewal of baptismal vows that would come at the Easter Vigil. And this was because baptism isn't just a recollection of getting wet once, but of being incorporated into the dying and rising of Christ. And so even today, whether you're getting ready for baptism or not, Lent is a time of getting ready for the new life Jesus brings in Easter, not only at the end of time, but right now.

And so rather than simply viewing Lent as a time of extra spiritual devotion, we should see it as a time that God is preparing us for the new life of Easter. And as for the first disciples, that new life begins in this world.

And so, as we go through this month, and this season of Lent, we'll read stories about people of faith who are on various journeys. We'll read stories about people being healed of disease. We'll read stories of people who are challenged to think "outside the box" and recognize new ways that God is moving in their lives. These are all some of the ways that Jesus "transitioned" people into new life with him.

So don't just listen to the stories. Use them as opportunities in your life. Consider how God is using the story to call you to journey beyond an old season into a new time of life and growth. Open yourself to how God might be using the story to help heal you of old pain so that you can live in a new way. And be willing to think "outside the box" in your own life to recognize how God may be

moving and acting to transition you into a new time and season in your life and faith.

Honduras Mission Trip 2023

We are excited to announce that this summer, Prince of Peace is sending a group of six missionaries to Honduras with non-profit, Haven Universe. This year we have several projects to support and are asking for your help in March:

- Build 10 latrines for a community up in the mountains which will greatly improve their lives and sanitary conditions. \$3,270.00
- Build a duplex house for two families. \$6,190.00
- Painting at CEPI, a special needs school in Copan. \$500




Sunday School

Gaithersburg HELP is looking for volunteers to take on a variety of tasks. If you have time to share, please consider getting involved.

Drivers, to take clients to appointments on weekdays. Select one or more times to drive per month, typically in the Gaithersburg/Rockville area. The need is usually for elderly folks to get to medical appointments.

Three jobs that can be done from home one day a month or more if you choose. (1) Transportation schedulers, (2) Food Coordinator and (3) Spanish Speaking Coordinator. All of these involve working on your computer and phone to schedule clients for needed services.
