From Pastor Steve...

Every year, the Day of Pentecost falls on a Sunday very close to our Yard Sale. I always think this is appropriate, because in one sense, Pentecost is the story of the disciples of Jesus getting “out of the house.” In the days following Easter, the disciples had mostly stayed locked up in the house where they were staying when they had first come to Jerusalem with Jesus for the Passover. After Jesus was crucified, they were scared and worried for their own safety. But even after the Risen Jesus appeared to them multiple times, they still pretty much stayed locked up in the house as far as we can tell.

They did follow Jesus up to the Mount of Olives, and they watched him ascend into heaven. Jesus had told them to stay in the city (but not necessarily in the house!) until they had been “clothed with power from on high” (whatever that meant). Yet because they really were still scared and probably confused, they mostly stayed in the house.

What happened on Pentecost was that the Holy Spirit drove them outside the house. They apparently didn’t go far. They were probably just in the street in front of the house. They had no plan to witness to Jesus. And they didn’t know the Spirit would show up on the day of Pentecost, so in many ways, they weren’t prepared. But the Spirit did amazing work in and through them! They were able to communicate with people they probably would never have imagined talking to. They showed God at work in ways they hadn’t imagined and didn’t even realize themselves at the time. And they began to live into a new chapter of their lives because of that day. And it all happened because they simply were willing to go outside of the house.

And in many ways, getting “outside of the house” of the church building each year gives us the same opportunities. We get to meet people we might not interact with otherwise. People get to see God working in and through us, even if it doesn’t occur to us that we’re doing anything other than “working the yard sale.” And sometimes, simply

the ability of folks in our community to see us, instead of just our building, creates space for the Spirit to work in and through us that wouldn’t be there if we just stayed in the “house.”

So, I pray that this Yard Sale may be a great time for all of us in being open to what the Holy Spirit can do with us as we get outside the “house” and open ourselves to some new things that God may do with us.

Honduras Mission Trip 2023

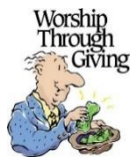

- Build 10 more latrines for a community up in the mountains which will greatly improve their lives and sanitary conditions. \$4,500
- Build a house for a family. \$3,500
- Construction and painting for FUNTEAH's, a Christian disability organization in Tegucigalpa, day program building. \$6,500.00

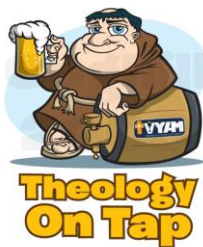

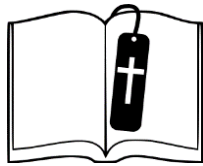

Social Justice Ministry News

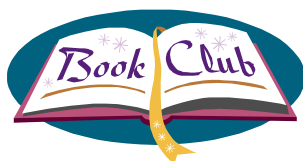

UMD Extension Office Visit and Site

Assessment for Sacred Grounds It was a beautiful Wednesday morning for our site assessment and property visit by [Amanda Rockler](#) of the UMD Extension office. As part of the visit, Ms. Rockler walked the church property with Pastor Steve, council president Jon Conary, and several members of the PoP Green Team to learn about water runoff / management concerns, goals for the property, and help us evaluate different site options for the pollinator garden to be installed as part of the Sacred Grounds program. Tonya Meyer organized the visit, along with Anna Awimbo, the Director of Leadership Development for the [Interfaith Partners for the Chesapeake](#), who was able to join us as well. Ms. Rockler had several great initial suggestions for ways to manage the church's green spaces, and potentially use conservation landscaping to help with slowing the

flow of runoff and even qualify for rain tax credits. After the final site assessment is prepared, the team will review Ms. Rockler's recommendations for the garden location and types of native plantings that are most likely to thrive with the church council. We will also use her suggestions to request new tree installations on church grounds through the county's [Tree Montgomery](#) program, which provides free trees to homeowners, businesses, and non-profits in Montgomery County.
