From Pastor Steve... Pastor Steve Buechler

As we move into the fall, the second summer of my new vegetable garden is soon going to be coming to a close. A couple of years ago, as a result of having to take down a big tree in my backyard that had been killed by a lightning strike, I found myself having a big sunny area where I could finally grow things like tomatoes and beans. And so, I started out with a small plot, and I got some good things from my garden last season! But I also realized a made a number of mistakes. I planted some things too close together. I didn't properly support some of the plants. And I really needed to do some pruning that I never did.

So, this summer, I adapted from what I did last year, and things have been much better! Still, though, I've learned some things I'll need to do differently next year. I still haven't pruned enough. And as a result of doing a much better job with growing beans, they lived long enough for the bunnies to figure out how to overcome my "bunnie barrriers", so I'll have to find a new system for next year!

Whenever we come to a seasonal transition - whether it's the growing season, the season of the church year, or a season in our lives - it's good to reflect not only on where we've been, but on what we can learn for the next season. After all, new seasons are coming, and another season like the one we've just been through may be coming again, so it's not enough to just celebrate our victories or complain about our failures. It's important to see all kinds of seasonal transitions as opportunities God gives us to learn and grow and live more boldly into the next seasons of our lives.

In the last few years, I think we've done this well at Prince of Peace. As we came out of Covid, a lot of things had been shut down, and as we started them up again, we didn't do them just as we had done them before. But we also didn't get stuck in a rut and simply do them each year as we did them that first year after Covid. Instead, we asked what worked and what didn't; what went well and what needed to stop; and we kept looking forward and

asking ourselves how we could do better in the seasons ahead.

Especially as we begin September, and we come out of summer and resume a "normal" church schedule with a lot of classes and activities that are different from the summer, we're not just supposed to be getting back in the old routine. Instead, this is a transitional opportunity God gives us to reflect on what's worked well before and how we might make things better. It's an opportunity to give thanks for God's help in the past and to look forward to God's guidance in the future. And perhaps most importantly, to use this seasonal transition to prepare for the seasons that lie ahead.

Here are the updates from the Church Council meeting.

<u>Finances:</u> We have a 2025 budget that slightly exceeds estimated giving. Year to Date giving is about the same as 2024. (Council notes).

Feast Fund: The kitchen refresh is complete.

<u>VBS</u>: Evening VBS was successful once again. The Youth made crafts, acted out a Bible story, played a game, sang some songs and had a great opening with Scout and Emma.

<u>Maintenance:</u> The parking lot has had the cracks filled, been sealed and restriped. We do have a few places that should be repaved, but the work done this summer should allow us to go a few years before repaving the bad spots.

PreK-K and Elementary School Classes

This year, our time together will begin with some lively, VBS-style music. Once in our classes, we will use Group's Simply Loved curriculum, which incorporates popular VBS elements such as Bible buddies, videos, and games. Our first stories will highlight children and women, emphasizing God's knowledge of us and the assistance he provides.

Our music leader is Sonvy Waidler. Workshop leaders are Lisa Conary, Janet Levine, Jamie Pflasterer, and Anne Witten. year, spending is higher than income, but financial donations usually pick up toward year end.

Along with the Episcopal Church of the Ascension, Fairhaven United Methodist, Shaare Torah, and other local churches and synagogues, Prince of Peace followed the nearly two-year program to spread the word about the benefits of using native plants, support giveaways of native plants to church members and neighbors, and to plant a native pollinator garden. Tonya Meyer attended the graduation ceremony (pictured below with Ethan Lucas from Interfaith Power and Light and Naomi Edelson from the National Wildlife Federation). The plague we received is now on display in the Narthex. Thanks to everyone's help to plant the native garden in the fall, care for the garden with watering/weeding/fencing/plant markers, and especially Pastor Steve's blessing to bring the plants to life, the garden has filled out and bloomed beautifully over the summer. You may even spot some bees and butterflies enjoying the Coreopsis, Sneezeweed, Blue & Red cardinal flowers, Black-Eyed Susans, and Blazing Star. Please stop by and take a look!

RECENT EVENTS August 2025 Service Sunday Event

SET THEM UP FOR SUCCESS VOLLEYBALL TOURNAMENT

The second Set Them Up For Success Volleyball Tournament, benefitting the New Neighbor Interfaith Alliance (NNIA), is in the history books. The Tournament raised about three times as much as the year before, making it a true success. NNIA (https://nnia-maryland.org/) helps refugees gain access to medical care, food assistance, enrolls children in school, provides tutoring, helps refugees find employment, and more. Undergirding this work is financial assistance. Reaching financial security and independence takes time, and many refugees struggle to pay rent for the first few months in the country. The proceeds of the tournament, of all this effort and fun, will help keep families in the home and enable them to reach self-sufficiency even sooner.

So, thanks to all who bought raffle tickets and congratulations to our winners - Jon and Lisa Conary won the Bellini Basket, and Dick Moore went home with a basket of original Afghan art.
