“God helps those who help themselves.” This is a quote that’s often attributed to Benjamin Franklin. But it’s not in the Bible. Jesus didn’t say it. And yet, there are many Christians who take it to heart as an article of faith.

But Easter is a time when we remember the real point of our faith: God helps us even and especially when we CAN’T help ourselves. The Resurrection is the good news that God restores us to life even when we’re dead. The Resurrection is the good news that God changes things that we can’t, no matter how hard we work at it. The Resurrection is the good news that our future - and the future of the whole world - depends not on us, but on the God who made us and loves us.

It is of course also true that pretty much everything Jesus calls us to do to live as his disciples can’t be done by - as Luther says in the Small Catechism - our own reason and strength. We do indeed need God’s help for everything we do. And knowing that God will help us is never an excuse to sit back and let God do the work God calls us to do.

But our hope is not in our hard work. Our hope is not that God will give us superhuman strength if we try hard enough. Our hope is not that eventually we will evolve into a people who can bring about the salvation of this world.

Our hope is in the God who helps us when we can’t help ourselves. Our hope is in the power of God, whose love and strength are greater than death. Our hope is in the Risen One who makes all things new even and especially when we can’t.

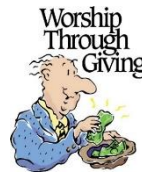

Sunday School Schedule

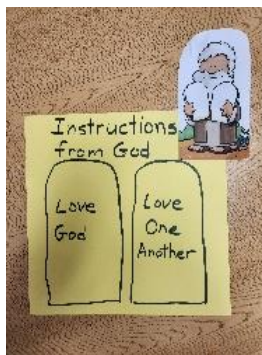
Sunday School will not be held on Palm Sunday,

Sunday School

The PreK-K class has been enjoying the song “Deep
and Wide” with Ms. Sonvy, using scarves for
“water”. We have been focusing on the Old
Testament and the story of the prophet Elijah. In
the pictures below, learners “passed the torch” to
a friend, just like Elijah did to Elisha, when it was
time for him to be taken up into heaven. For our
craft we made a chariot of fire, and some very
colorful horses!



Elisha told the powerful Naaman to wash in the
river seven times to be healed. At first, Naaman
did not want to follow the instructions God
conveyed through Elisha, but once he did, he
realized God’s power. We talked about the
instructions God gave us through the Ten
Commandments, which Jesus summarized as loving
God and loving one another. Then the learners
painted Naaman bathing in the river.

Yard Sale 101 / FAQ

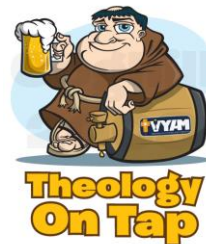

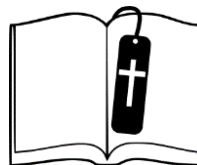

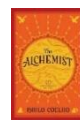
Food trucks will be on-site, and Nauticon will be raffling thousands of dollars of prizes, including a \$2,500 travel voucher.

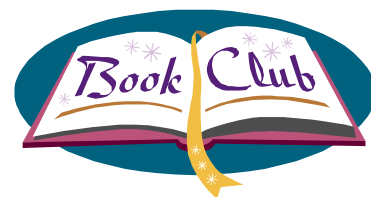

LENTEN EVENINGS

Visit from [Stepping Stones Family Shelter](#) in Rockville

Before the March 4th Holden Evening prayer service, PoP members were able to hear directly from Stepping Stones' Director of Community Engagement, Mercedes Brandt, about the impact that the Prince of Peace dinner donations and Lenten sharing bags have for the clients that they serve.

Stepping Stones is a non-profit family shelter located in Rockville, that serves families experiencing homelessness, both single parent and two parent households. Some of the households served can be quite large, with 6-8 children. In addition to providing food and shelter, Stepping Stones also supports families with individualized case management, employment and housing support, life skills and financial literacy guidance, childcare, legal help when needed, and mental and physical healthcare. One of the happiest occurrences is when a family is



able to move from the shelter into permanent housing - Stepping Stones helps with providing move-in kits for families, including everything from shower kits to toasters.

Visit from Pastor Christine - Update on the Work at [Lutheran Social Services](#)

We enjoyed a visit from Pastor Christine before the March 18th Holden Evening prayer service, to hear about the new ways that LSS is serving the community including [Dignity Behavior Health](#), [Dignity Immigration Legal Services](#), and [Dignity Thrift](#) opening later this spring. All of these professional services are open to the entire community to use (not just limited to LSS clients), at very accessible costs. Pastor Christine also mentioned a need for additional [foster parents](#) in the DMV, and especially for homes that provide foster respite care. LSS's primary requirement is the ability to love a child - married couples, same-sex couples, single people, homeowners and renters, and people new to parenting are all eligible to foster children.
